In the 2016 election, you will be asked to vote in support of or opposition to a wide range of propositions and measures that could affect business in San Luis Obispo County. In recent months, SLO Chamber committees and Board of Directors studied each ballot initiative below to develop the Chamber position.

## **SLO County**

Measure I	Lucia Mar Unified School District facilities bond	<b>YES</b> , as it supports high quality instruction and serves the K-12 educational needs of our region
Measure J	SLO County Self-Help initiative	<b>YES</b> , as it provides local control in order to self-fund specific, regional transportation projects
Measure M	Paso Robles Joint Unified School District facilities bond	<b>YES</b> , as it supports high quality instruction and serves the K-12 educational needs of our region

Proposition 51	Funding for K-12 school and community college facilities
Proposition 52	Extension of the Medi-Cal hospital fee program
Proposition 53	Voter approval for bond funded infrastructure projects over \$2 billion
Proposition 54	Public display of legislative bills prior to vote
Proposition 55	Tax extension to fund education and healthcare
Proposition 57	Juvenile criminal proceedings and sentencing
Proposition 64	Legalization of recreational marijuana
Proposition 67	Referendum to overturn ban on single-use plastic bags
